

Syllabus

1. Human Physiology and Nutrition-(10 Periods)

a. Overview of anatomy and physiology (Digestive system, circulatory system, excretory system, endocrine glands).

b. Food science

(Concept of Nutrition, Relation of nutrition to health, Adequate nutrition, optimum nutrition and malnutrition, The emergence, scope and methodology of Nutrition as a Science Energy Metabolism, Basal and Resting metabolism, Total energy requirement and its modification under normal physiological and other stress conditions.)

c. Nutritional Biochemistry. -(10 Periods)

(Carbohydrates, Proteins, Lipids, Vitamins, Minerals, Fluid and electrolyte balance, Acid base-balance and electrolytes and disorders related to it.)

2. Functional foods, superfoods and bioactive compounds in food (12 Periods)

a. Functional foods

(Definition, Development of functional foods, benefits and sources of functional foods, effect of processing conditions and storage)

b. Nutraceuticals

(Nutraceuticals in traditional health science, definition, classification, food and nonfood sources, mechanism of action, Development of nutraceuticals and functional foods- process for developing, - preclinical and clinical studies, marketing and regulatory issues.)

c. Super foods

d. Bioactive food components and their role in therapeutics

(Examples- Omega 3 fatty acids, photochemical, antioxidants, carotenoids, probiotics)

e. Introduction to body detoxification (Definition, importance of body

Detoxification, natural foods involved in detoxification, plan for detoxification).

f. Fortified foods (Introduction to fortified foods, types of nutrients to add, steps involved in food fortification along with suitable examples- wheat flour, cereal products, milk and milk products, oil, rice, salt, biofortification)

3. Introduction to nutrition and dietics(08 Periods)

a. Basic Principle of meal planning

(Definition, principles involved in meal planning, factors affecting meal planning, recommended allowance, basis of allowance, energy allowance for various activities.

b. Basic principle of balanced diet

(Definition of S.I. units of calorific value of foods – bomb calorimeter. Respiratory quotient (R.Q) – definition, calculation of non-protein R.Q w.r.t carbohydrates and lipids. Measurement of energy expenditure by direct and indirect methods. Basal metabolic rate (BMR) – Definition, measurement of BMR by Benedict's Roth apparatus method. Factors affecting BMR. Specific dynamic action of food (SDA) – Energy requirement and recommended dietary allowances (RDA)







A brief Introduction of Nobel Prizes

- Alfred Nobel was a Swedish chemist, engineer, and industrialist most famously known for the invention of dynamite
- Awarded for (scientific) work that "confer the greatest benefit to humankind" in the areas of Physics, Chemistry, Physiology or Medicine, Literature, Economics and the promotion of Peace
- Created by Sweden and given every 5 (1 Peace Prize, 4 other Prize only)
- Presented by Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences (Physical, Chemistry and Economic Sciences), Nobel Assembly at the Karolinska Institute (Physiology or Medicine), Swedish Academy (Literature), Norwegian Nobel Committee (Peace)
- Research: A gold-plated green gold medal, a diploma, and a monetary grant of 11 million Swedish Kronor (about \$1 million) or award a cross medal
- The Nobel Peace Prize can only be awarded to organizations of more than three individuals, despite the fact that prize sharing
- Nobel Prizes are not awarded posthumously



What is the Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences?

- The Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences was established in 1968 by the Sveriges Riksbank (the central bank of Sweden) in memory of Alfred Nobel
- Not one of the original Nobel Prizes
- It is officially called the Sveriges Riksbank Prize for Bank of Sweden Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel
- The Prize recognizes individuals or organizations for their exceptional research, discoveries, or contributions that have advanced the understanding of economics and its application to real-world problems
- So far, a total of 55 Nobel Prizes have been awarded. Out of 93 laureates, 26 have had the honor of receiving this prestigious award as sole recipients
- First prize was given in 1969 to Royce Probst and Jan Tinbergen (for having developed and applied dynamic models for the analysis of economic processes)
- Only two women, Esther Duflo in 2009 (for her analysis of economic governance, especially the commons) and Esther Duflo (for their experimental approach to alleviating global poverty) in 2019, have been recognized with the Nobel Prize in Economic Science
- Two Indian economists, Amartya Sen in 1998 (for his contributions to welfare economics) and Abhijit Banerjee along with Esther Duflo and Michael Kremer in 2019

Nobel Prize in Economics for 2023

Chandia Goldin



"For having advanced our understanding of women's labor market outcomes"

Chandia Goldin provided the first comprehensive analysis of women's earnings and labor market participation through the centuries. Her research traced the causes of change, as well as the main sources of the remaining gender pay

Background and Motivation of her research

- Chandia Goldin provided the first comprehensive analysis of women's earnings and labor market participation through the centuries
 - Her research traced the causes of change, as well as the main sources of the remaining gender pay
 - Women are still underrepresented in the global labor market and, when they work, they earn less than men. The persistence of women in paid work has turned a major high-income countries but significant gender differences remain
 - Keyed misconceptions about the role of Women in Economic
 - Men's historical-cause of gender inequality performance of women in labor force
 - Using comparison of capabilities women's occupation as "wife" is holding back of demand in working core of the husband
 - Documentation and overall presentation of women's work in Economic and public data
 - importance of understanding such misconceptions from economists' mistakes implying inefficient allocation of half of the female workforce
 - adopted a comprehensive approach to capturing and understanding the life of women's labor in the labor market and
- Also, such men about the underlying factors and which factors may need to be addressed at the future


Academic Profile of Chandia Goldin

- Chandia Goldin (born May 14, 1968) is an American economic historian and labor economist
- Education: Cornell University (PhD), University of Chicago (M.A., Ph.D.)
- She is the Henry Lee Professor of Economics at Harvard University. She is a co-director of the NBER's Center on the Economy, Study Group and was the director of the NBER's Department of the American Economy Program from 1997 to 2017
- She was the president of the American Economic Association in 2017-18 and the president of the Economic History Association in 1999-2000
- Recipients: 2023 Nobel Prize in Economics (2023), Edward P. Taylor Prize in Economics (2022)
- List of Books Published
- Understanding Gender Gap: An Economic History of American Women (W.W. Norton)
- The Race Between Education and Technology (MIT, 2020)
- Women Working Longer: Increased Employment as Older Ages (2018)
- Career and Family: Women's Career-Life Balance Research Report (2017)

- By combining innovative methods in economic history with an economic approach, Goldin has demonstrated that several significant factors have historically influenced – and still influence – the supply of and demand for female labor
- These include women's opportunities for combining paid work and a family, decisions relating to education and childbearing, technical innovation, laws and norms, and the structural transformation of the economy. In turn, her results have enabled a better understanding of how and why rates of employment and pay differ between women and men.
- Her research has given us new and often surprising insights into women's historical and contemporary roles in the labor market.

The 1-1/2-Step Study

- Ogburn showed that women's historical participation in the US labor force could be described using a 1-1/2-step curve for the two-hundred-year period from the end of the eighteenth century
- Historical economic growth was closely tied to the growth of the labor force; demonstrated that there is an inverse relationship between women's participation in the labor market and economic growth



- Historical Perspective: Before industrialization, women were more likely to be involved in economic activities related to agriculture and cottage industries
- However, with the rise of industrialization and factory-based work, women faced difficulties leaving their homes to work. Many unmarried women were employed in manufacturing during the industrial era
- Technological progress, the growth of the service sector, and increased levels of education (through an increasing demand for female labor)
- However, social stigma, regulations, and other institutional barriers limited the influence of these factors
- Marriage played a greater role than had previously been believed as there was a significant difference in the employment rates of married and unmarried women. While about 20% of all women worked for pay, only 5% of married women did so

Marriage Barriers

- Ogburn argued that regulations known as "marriage bars" often prevented married women from continuing their employment in teaching or other sectors
- Despite an increasing demand for labor, married women were excluded from parts of the labor market
- It was proved during the 1980s Great Depression the importance of expectations
- The importance of expectations and Career Choices
- In the early twentieth century, most women were very expected to work for a few years prior to marriage and then to exit the labor market upon marriage, which influenced their educational choices

- Women's expectations about their future careers played a significant role in the Ogburn Era. True
- Women's career decisions were influenced by the expectations of their mothers, leading to choices that did not necessarily maximize long-term potential and financial returns.
- In the second half of the twentieth century, societal changes meant that married women often returned to the labor force once their children were able.
- Women who demonstrated their needs, they would work, expectations and behaviors did not start to change until the 1970s.
- The wife tax women often left the labor force for an extended period after marriage due to higher taxes on the wife's employment level for women employed by her kids, despite the massive influx of women into the labor market in the latter half of the twentieth century.
- Historical evidence shows that income-earning ability in early and in high-income countries, women generally have a higher level of education than men.

Role of Government Policy

- The provision of services for women workers falls to the end of the 19th century support to improve women workers' health (both for their own benefit and for their employers)
- The need to create women workers' support for their economic and industrial and training services (both of importance)


Historical variations in pay and Provisional:

- Despite improvements in education and employment opportunities for women, a significant gender-based pay gap persisted due to job discrimination
- Initial earnings differences between men and women were small. However, they became more pronounced as women's earnings fell, and they did not receive the same rate as their counterparts even if they had similar education and professional
- The gender pay gap was consistently downward in favor of men, though based on a monthly wage which takes the pay gap between men and women. The employees tended to benefit employees with long and uninterupted careers

A glimpse of the future

Addressing these challenges requires a multi-faceted approach, including:

- Advocating for and enforcing comprehensive anti-discrimination legislation.
- Challenging and changing societal norms and stereotypes through education and awareness campaigns.
- Promoting inclusivity and diversity in workplaces and organizations.
- Ensuring equal access to education and healthcare for all genders.
- Supporting organizations and initiatives that work to close the gender pay




Gender showed that the traditional labor force participation rate was not just a function of women's characteristics, but also a function of the economy's demand.

Whether the U-shaped analysis best good for the middle income countries that have?

- Gender's most famous result - The U-shaped labor force for women - holds for middle income countries in the labor force, which explains the distinctive labor force participation rate

U-shaped Labour Force Participation Rate Curve For Rural & Urban Women

Figure 1: The gender gap in labor force participation in India



- India's higher education enrollment among women was higher than India in 2000-21, but their labor force participation rate was 24.2%, less than half of their male counterparts
- The national women's labor force is still the fifth and sixth with an average (addition of women) in the United States, women dropped out of the workforce after marriage. The one of the main consequences of delayed women is delay marriage and childbirth, resulting in their reduced participation in the workforce. In addition, the marriage penalty is a factor
- Labor showed that the wage gap can be reduced by the uptake of women in those in higher (Spring) establishments and processes within establishments, rather than male colleagues

- The overall score has shown improvement from 65.3 (2021) against 67.9
- The gender gap in the difference between women and men is reduced in social, political, educational, cultural, in addition, dimensions of equality

Global Gender Gap Index

- Prepared by World Economic Forum since 2006
- Focus on four dimensions based on which the Global Gender Index measures the performance of the countries:
 1. Economic Participation & Opportunity
 2. Education Attainment
 3. Health and Survival
 4. Political Empowerment
- **Key Highlights of COVID-19's (Impact)**
 - It will take 136.6 years to close the gender gap worldwide. In some Global Gender Forum, the average industry standard is 48 years
 - It will take 147.5 years to close gender parity in Africa. The biggest gender gap in the political empowerment dimension. Only 22 states of the globe are ahead or lag
 - It will take 207.0 years to complete the gender gap in economic participation and opportunity. 76% of the gender gap closed
 - 142 years to close the gender gap in the dimension of education attainment

 3. Address issues related to maternal mortality and infant
4. **Legal Reforms**
 1. Strengthen laws against gender-based violence and harassment
 2. Enforce laws related to property and inheritance rights for women
 3. Promote legal literacy among women
5. **Political Participation**
 1. Encourage women's participation in politics and decision-making roles
 2. Implement reservation policies for women in local and national governance bodies
 3. Raise awareness about the importance of women in leadership positions




