


Event Highlights:



6. Feedback Session




Key Observations



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DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN: AN UNFINISHED AGENDA

National Crime Record Bureau report shows stark increase in violence against women in India in the forms of dowry deaths, acts of sexual harassment, torture, rapes and domestic violence.

Violence against Women

- **The United Nations** defines violence against women as "any act of gender-based violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual, or mental harm or suffering to women, including threats of such acts, coercion or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life."
- Violence against women is a social, economic, developmental, legal, educational, human right, and health (physical and mental) issue.
- It is a preventable cause of **morbidity and mortality in women.**

Violence against women occurs throughout the life cycle from prebirth, infancy, childhood, adolescence, adulthood to old age.

Facts and Findings

- As per **World Health Organization (WHO)** findings about **1 in 3 (35%) women** worldwide have experienced either **physical or sexual intimate partner violence or non-partner sexual violence** in their lifetime.
- Violence against women – particularly **intimate partner violence and sexual violence** – is a major public health problem and a violation of women's human rights.
- Globally, **38% of murders of women** are committed by a **male intimate partner.**
- Violence can negatively affect women's **physical, mental, sexual and reproductive health**, and may increase the risk of acquiring HIV in some settings.

Predisposing Factors

- Men are more likely to perpetrate violence if they have **low education, a history of child maltreatment, exposure to domestic violence against their mothers, harmful use of alcohol, unequal gender norms** including attitudes accepting of violence, and a sense of entitlement over women.

- Women are more likely to experience intimate partner violence if they have **low education, exposure to mothers being abused by a partner, abuse during childhood, and attitudes accepting violence, male privilege, and women's subordinate status.**
- There is evidence that **advocacy and empowerment counseling interventions,** as well as home visitation are promising in preventing or reducing intimate partner violence against women.
- **Situations of conflict, post conflict and displacement may exacerbate existing violence,** such as by intimate partners, as well as non-partner sexual violence, and may also lead to new forms of violence against women.

Causes

- **Gender Disparity:** is one of the **deep rooted cause** of violence against women that put women at risk of several forms of violence.
 - **Discriminatory gender norms and gender stereotypes** results into structural inequality.
- **Psychiatric Morbidity:** Generally refers to the incidence of both **physical and psychological deterioration** as a result of a mental or psychological condition, generally caused due to the consumption of alcohol.
 - **Regular consumption of alcohol** by the husband has been strongly associated with poor mental health of women.
 - **Alcohol operates as a situational factor,** increasing the likelihood of violence by reducing inhibitions, clouding judgment and impairing an individual's ability to interpret cues.
- **Socio demographic factors: Patriarchy** has been cited as the main cause of violence against women. Where women have a higher economic status than their husbands and are seen as having sufficient power to change traditional gender roles, risk for violence is high.
- **Family factors:** Exposure to harsh physical discipline during childhood and witnessing the father beating the mother during childhood is a predictor of victimization and perpetration of violence against wife in adulthood.
- **Traditional and cultural practices:**
 - **Female genital mutilation:** Can lead to death, infertility, and long-term psychological trauma combined with increased physical suffering.
 - **Acid attacks:** Acid attacks have emerged as a cheap and readily accessible weapon to disfigure and sometimes kill women and girls for

reasons as varied as family feuds, inability to meet dowry demands, and rejection of marriage proposals.

- **Killing in the name of family honour:** In several countries of the world including Bangladesh, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Pakistan, Turkey, and India, women are killed to uphold the honour of the family due to varied reasons such as-alleged adultery, premarital relationship (with or without sexual relations), rape, falling in love with a person the family disapproves, which justify a male member of the family to kill the woman concerned.
- **Early marriages:** Early marriage with or without the consent of the girl, constitutes a form of violence as it undermines the health and autonomy of millions of girls.
- **Judiciary and law enforcement machinery:** An insensitive, inefficient, corrupt and unaccountable judicial system and law enforcement machinery fails to deter against various forms of crimes.
- **Socio cultural factors disfavoring women: Stereotypes of gender roles have continued over the ages.**
 - The primary roles for women have been **marriage and motherhood**.
 - Women must marry because an unmarried, separated or divorced status is a stigma.
 - The **custom of dowry** is still prevalent in Indian marriages.

Consequences

- **Health Issue:** Violence in any form affects not only physical mental sexual and reproductive health of women but also adversely affects their **self esteem, ability to work and make decisions about fertility**.
- **Economic Issue:** violence against women can have serious impact on economy of the household as well as of the nation.
 - **Direct cost:** loss of income, productivity, healthcare and cost of social services.
 - **Indirect cost:** Impact on child well being, female and child mortality, intergenerational social and psychological cost.
- **Development Issue:** Violence obstructs participation of women in development and planning programs both at micro and macro level.
 - Violence prevents women from experiencing or accessing the benefits of development by restricting their ability to act or move freely.

- Violence against women is an obstruction to poverty alleviation programs as it impedes equitable distribution of resources.
- **Rights Issue:** Any form of Violence against women hinders their realization of fundamental rights under article 14, 21, 19 and 32 of the Indian constitution.

Concerns

- **Underreporting:** According to WHO estimates less than 40 percent of the women who experience violence seek help of any sort.
 - Among women who seek help, tend to approach family and friends and very few look to formal institutions and mechanisms, such as police and health services.
 - Less than 10 percent of those women seeking help for experience of violence sought help by appealing to the police.
- **Erring Laws:** Most of the times laws and legislations for women safety are either not in compliance with the International standards or not implemented properly.
 - Laws relating to violence themselves constitute greater barrier against justice for women.
- **Dearth of Data and Statistics:** on crime against women.
 - There is a need of a **comprehensive and systematic research and analysis on crime against women** at Central, State, district and block level.
- **Accused are known persons:** from the family or neighborhood. Women are not safe among the people they know well and may be unsafe with dear and near ones.
- **Improper implementation:** Although many laws and legislations are existing but their full implementation in terms of legal literacy, training officials responsible for administering legislation, legal support services is not upto the mark.

Way Forward

- **Gender based legislation:** It is important to enact and enforce legislation and develop and implement policies that promote gender equality by ending discrimination against women in marriage, divorce and custody laws, inheritance laws and ownership of assets.
- **Financial Independence:** Improving women's access to paid employment.
- **Developing and resourcing national plans and policies** to address violence against women.
- Improve system of collecting crime surveillance data on violence against women.

- **Capacity building and training** to service providers and law enforcement officers to handle cases of violence against women.
- **Male Mediated Initiatives:** Ensure **male involvement** in devising program for abusers.
- **Prevent recurrence of violence:** Through early identification of women and children who are experiencing violence and providing appropriate referral and support
- **Promote egalitarian gender norms** as part of life skills and comprehensive sexuality education curricula taught to young people.
- **Gender based surveys:** Generate evidence on what works and on the magnitude of the problem by carrying out **population-based surveys, or including violence against women in population-based demographic and health surveys**, as well as in surveillance and health information systems.

CONCLUSION

Therefore, from the above-mentioned argument and reasoning, it is clear beyond a shred of doubt that there is a high prevalence of all types of violence against women in all socio-economic contexts in all over the Indian region. We have enough laws for the safety of women in implemented with efficiency, have the power to maintain law and order in the society and punish the criminals who commit crime in the society. But to keep pace with the world or due to the changing socio-economic fabric of the country we need to improve the existing law to keep pace with the modern time.

EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT

What is education?

It's a process of transferring knowledge and skills from one generation to another that brings about a positive change and refines the mind with an ability to think and act in the most effective manner.

Nelson Mandela – "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world".

R. Tagore – "The highest education is that which does not merely give us information but makes our life in harmony with all existence.".....

"The widest road leading to the solution of all our problems is education."

Why Education?

- Education plays a **major role in a nation's development** and is a **basic right of every human being**.
- **Modern education opened up a new world** for us by providing an opportunity to **question our beliefs, our customs and our knowledge** and with that questioning, the spirit of education dawned.
- **Europe could march to development only after Renaissance**.
- Similarly, **Indians could question the evils of sati and caste system, received impetus for freedom movement** only when we were exposed to new liberal and egalitarian ideas through education.
- Education arms **individuals specially young individuals with the power of knowledge** to create scope for the social development.
- The **scope of education is not confined to the 3Rs** (reading, writing, and arithmetic), it has a distinct role to play in the society for the **attainment of social and human development**.

What is Development ?

- Development is often understood with **economic connotations** (Increase in GNP or GDP) .
- This approach to development, however, **has not been able to yield the desired result to humanity, especially in the developing countries**.

- The essential truth is that **people must be at the center** of all development
- Apart from access to income, there should be other options of **long life, knowledge, political freedom, personal security, community participation and guaranteed human rights.**
- The basic objective of development is to **create enabling environment for the people to enjoy a healthy and creative life.**

According to Amartya Sen (1995) –

“Social development is equality of social opportunities”.

Let's look at Education playing a significant role in all aspects of development

Education and Literacy Development

- Literacy status in India: **Around 75%**
- The Male literacy rate – **80.89%** and, Female literacy rate is **64.64%**.
- India's literacy rate continues to rise, however, there are many states in the country with low literacy rates.

Odisha has occupied 26th position in India with **72.87%** literacy rate.

- **Literacy rate is recognized as the major determinant** of socio-economic development.
- **Sarva Siksha Abhiyan** represents the effort of the govt. to **universalize elementary education.**

- Children are encouraged to **learn about the natural environment** that envelops them, **work for each other's wellbeing** and **develop both spiritually and materially**.
- There is **community ownership of school-based intervention** through decentralization.
- As a result we see a drastic fall in the **gender gap in literacy** during last decades.

Education supports Social and Human Development

- **3 basic dimensions of HDI** as a measure of **social and economic well-being** of the people and the community. There are;
 - Long and healthy life expectancy** at birth;
 - Knowledge** as measured by adult literacy and,
 - Standard of living** as measured by gross domestic product (GDP)
- **Social development** as the process aims at '**Capacity Building**'
 - of individuals**, to grow and make effective contribution
 - of social groups** to participate in development processes, and
 - of society** to govern itself and manage change.

1. Education for Capacity Building:

- The terms '**community participation**', '**people's movements**' that promote decentralization and, ensure grassroot development.

2. Education and Women empowerment

- Empowerment – a means of creating a social environment in which one can make decisions and make choices either individually or collectively for social transformation.
- The empowerment strengthens the innate ability by way of acquiring knowledge, power and experience and enables women to respond to the challenges, confront their traditional role and bring changes.
- Provision of basic education and life-skill training through informal means to women in rural and backward areas help to realize their self-worth and the value of empowerment (Mission Shakti).
- Another endeavour is to ensure access and quality education to girls belonging to SCs, STs, OBCs, and minorities in low female literacy districts (Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV)).
- There are also several programs for adult education that combine formal education with vocational programs.

3. Education and Employment Generation

The provision of vocationalization ensures

- Diversification of educational opportunities leading to employment opportunities, and,
- Reduction of imbalance between demand and supply of skilled manpower

Focus on Digitalization in Education -

- Education in field of IT has opened galaxy of opportunities in urban India with jobs in software, call centers and BPO's ushering in a revolution of sorts.
- The services sector, in this backdrop, is also proving a significant contributor to the growth of economy.

Role of universities -

- Create a breed of individuals who are capable to chart their future.
- Enhance the level of confidence which capacitates individuals to compete globally.
- Develop entrepreneurial spirit to create jobs and set up corporate empires to employ people.

4. Education and Innovation

- Innovation in education is about more than new technology.
- It's about solving a real problem in a fresh and, simple way
- It encourages teachers and students to explore new and do research
- The socio-economic challenges that we encounter everyday life situation can only be addressed by education and research-driven innovation (multi-disciplinary approach)

- The 'Adult Education Programme' and 'National Rural Education Programme' still have long distance to cover.
- By promoting quality teaching in village schools, we can not only curb the problem of migration, but also educate students with the help of indigenous knowledge.

In fact, traditional knowledge, e.g., water harvesting, local food processing, fish farming, metal casting etc. have significant potential for inclusion in the school curriculum.

- Existing challenges such as shortage of teachers, poor infrastructure and lack of quality education must be addressed properly.
- Education based on awareness creates responsible citizens and demand accountable governance.

6. Education and Democracy

- Education plays a critical role in the democratic set up where an educated voter can make an informed choice.
- The voice of ballots gets translated into the fate of the voters.

- **Govt. policies under the surveillance** of educated common man functions better for a holistic and inclusive development.
- Often, the fruits of growth fail to reach the bottom of the pyramid. Such **accumulation of wealth with few individuals has led to wide gulfs** in the society.
- **Balancing of wealth** in the society can occur when people imbibe the importance of education to change their fortunes.

7. Education and Social Progress

- Social progress can only be ensured through **internalization of the values** such as **gender equity, sustainable living, mutual goodwill and peaceful coexistence**
- In this process, **education facilitate a conducive base** to fulfill all these basic conditions for social progress.
- **All great civilizations of the world**, which are remembered as developed, had attained that zenith on basis of importance accorded to education in those societies.
- Education is the real crusader of **ensuring equity, justice and development** and these are fundamental requirements for the realization of SDG. Goals.
- Progress also refers to a **holistic development** of the society when the **material wealth is complemented by cultural, social and educational achievements**.
- These are reflected in the promotion of art, architecture, music, writings and local heritage of that society. Education plays an instrumental role to it.
